Mr. and Miss 4-H Applications Due June 28!

The Johnson County Mr. and Miss 4-H Program recognizes young people for the leadership and commitment they have contributed to the 4-H program and their communities. Mr. and Miss 4-H support and participate in county events and activities throughout the year including Fair and promote Johnson County 4-H in the community. All 4-H'ers who have been a member for at least three years and are at least 13 (before January 1, 2024) are eligible to apply. More information about the Mr. and Miss 4-H Program can be found at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/mr-and-miss-4-h.html. The application is also posted at the above website and is due June 28. Interviews will be held at the Extension office on the evening of July 17.

County Fair Entries

4-H entries for exhibits judged during the county fair are due Wednesday, July 24. All entries for Dog, Interior Design & Architecture, Sewing & Textile Design, and Shopping in Style are due on **July 1**. Late entries will not be accepted and if a 4-H'er does not meet the deadline they will not be allowed to have their project judged in the 4-H division.

All sheep, swine, beef and goat exhibitors will be required to submit stall requests and tag numbers by Wednesday, July 24. If your family has weighed and tagged their animals under a family nomination, you will be required to enter the tag number(s) with the 4-H member's name who is exhibiting the animal by the July 24 deadline. Livestock exhibitors: you must enter in showmanship if you plan on exhibiting in showmanship.

Only online entries are accepted. The entry system is now open and is accessible through the Johnson County Fair website at www.jocokansasfair.com.

Note: Once an entry is submitted it cannot be edited. If assistance is needed in making online entries please contact the Extension office or the Fair office. It is highly recommended that you print off your entry confirmation. After the entry deadline adding an entry is not an option.

All entries including livestock must be accompanied at check-in with a printed entry tag.

Pullorum-Typhoid Testing for Poultry Fair Exhibitors

Kansas continues its designation as a Pullorum-Typhoid (P-T) Clean state. The Johnson County 4-H Fair Book states that all poultry (chickens, turkeys, and guineas) must show proof of negative Pullorum-Typhoid testing at check-in. Testing is generally completed at least 2 weeks prior to exhibition start date. The exception is birds that are less than 90 days old.

Fairgrounds Clean Up/Set Up

The Johnson County Fair relies on volunteers for a successful fair and clubs are expected to support the event by helping with the clean-up before, during, and after fair. The schedule with each club's work day is posted at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html. If you as a club member cannot make your club's assigned time, please come on an alternate date and help another club. Also, please bring the appropriate cleaning supplies necessary for your club to clean your area. Each club should bring brooms as every building will need swept. Teen 4-H'ers and parents are welcome to bring a Weed Eater if they would like to assist with trimming around buildings and fences during clean up days.

Johnson County 4-H Fair Book Updates

Following are updates to the 2024 Johnson County Fair 4-H Book:

- The following departments' name has changed to match Kansas 4-H projects and the Kansas State Fair
 - Clothing Construction is now Sewing & Textile Design
 - Energy Management is now Electric and Small Engines
 - Fashion Revue is now Shopping in Style
 - Home Environment is now Interior Design & Architecture
 - Plant Science is now Agronomy, Forestry, and Horticulture
 - Public Presentations is now Communications
 - STEM has been broken down into these individual departments: Ag Mechanics Welding, Building Block Engineering, Astronomy / Uncrewed Aircraft Systems, and Aerospace / Rocketry
 - Technology & Computers is now Computer Science and Robotics
- Art entries are limited to a maximum of 3 exhibits total.
- **Fiber Arts** conference judging is limited to 1 item.
- Foods and Nutrition judging will end at 7 p.m. on Monday.
- Interior Design & Architecture entries will be due July 1 and project check-in and judging will take place on Saturday, July 20 at Aldersgate United Methodist Church. Project check-in will be at 1 p.m. All projects must be transported and taken back in the same day by the participant. Projects must be out of the space by 3:30 p.m. that day. (More information will be coming on how to sign-up for conference judging.)
- Shopping in Style class Everything Under \$15 is now Everything Under \$20!

Food and Clothing Labels

Food labels (including those for Food Preservation) are available on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html to print off at home, or they can be picked up at the Extension office.

Clothing labels can be made by printing in ink on a 3" x 2½" piece of cloth: Class Number, County, Name, Age, and Level.

Please refer to your department's rules in the fair book regarding labels.

Departmental Forms

Some departments such as Electric, Shopping in Style, and Aerospace/Rocketry require additional forms along with the entry. These forms are posted on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html. Please refer to each department's rules in the fair book regarding what forms are required.

Entering Quilts in the Fair

If you are entering a quilt in the Johnson County Fair the ideal department to enter it in is the Fiber Arts department. The judge for Fiber Arts will be more experienced with quilts and therefore better able to give 4-H'ers helpful feedback.

Photo Mats and Photo Sleeves

The Extension office has photo mats and protective photo sleeves available for purchase. The cost for the pair is \$1.50. You will not receive the photo sleeve at the time of purchase as photos will be placed in the photo sleeve by the superintendents during judging. Use a large zip top bag to transport your photos to the fairgrounds for judging. Photos exhibited in the 4-H Photography division at the county fair are required to be mounted on a photo mat. Photo mounting directions and labels can be picked up at the Extension office and they are also posted at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html to print at home.

4-H Foods Judging

The judging for 4-H Foods and Nutrition will take place at Gardner Elementary School from 2-7 p.m. on Monday, July 29. (Participants in the Dog or Horse Shows may come for judging from 12:30-1:30 p.m.) As you research and test recipes for your food entries, make sure to check out the "4-H Foods Entry Tips for Fair" and the "Frosting & Filling Guidelines for the Johnson County Fair" documents posted on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html.

For food preservation entries, remember to only use CLEAR canning jars for the fair. Save the colored blue and green canning jars for home use. Colored jars may have to be opened to check canned ingredients and if it is opened it cannot go on for further judging due to food safety issues. Cloverbuds Show and Share

Enrolled Cloverbuds are invited to participate in Show and Share on Tuesday, July 30. This is a reminder that Cloverbuds are not eligible to compete in the 4-H division at the fair. Full membership starts when youth turn 7 before January 1 of the current 4-H year. Cloverbuds are encouraged to show and share 1-2 projects. Sign-ups for time slots will be available on July 10. For more information about activities for Cloverbuds, visit www.kansas4-h.org/4-h-programs/cloverbuds/.

Project Check-in and Judging

Project check-in will be Monday evening (July 29) from 6:30-9 p.m. and Tuesday morning (July 30) from 8-10 a.m. Projects not checked in by 10 a.m. on Tuesday will not be eligible to be exhibited. Plan on arriving before 10 a.m. on Tuesday to have ample time to check in all of your projects. Livestock exhibitors, please refer to the fair book for your check-in time.

We will again be using SignUpGenius for families to select a conference judging time slot for 4-H'ers. The link to the sign-ups will be posted on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html and will open on July 10. Projects for departments judged before fair have their own judging schedule. Families enrolled in the corresponding projects in 4-H Online will receive information detailing judging for these departments.

4-H Food Stand

The 4-H Food Stand is a great way for youth to help raise funds for Johnson County 4-H Council while practicing safe food handling, interacting with the community and working collaboratively with their club members! Be prepared to work a short shift at the 4-H Food Stand during fair on your club's assigned day. The funds raised help sponsor county events such as Club Day and Achievement Celebration. The food stand schedule is posted on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/johnson-county-fair.html.

Livestock T-shirts

The Johnson County Fair Association requires all livestock exhibitors to wear Johnson County Fair t-shirts when exhibiting livestock at the fair. The fair association will have a new t-shirt design this year. One t-shirt per 4-H'er is free, additional t-shirts are \$10 each.

Livestock and Project Auctions

See the 4-H/FFA Livestock Auction section or the 4-H Project Auction section in the 4-H Fair Book for more details about the Livestock Auction and Project Auction.

Livestock Auction: In order to sell their livestock, exhibitors must turn in auction forms and fill out and sign a W-9 IRS Form by 10 a.m. on Wednesday.

Project Auction: Project auction entry forms must be turned in by 12 p.m. on Thursday in the 4-H Building. No late entries will be accepted. An exhibitor selling a project for \$600 or more must complete a W-9 Tax ID (social security) form to the Extension office within 5 days of the auction.

State Fair Entries

4-H exhibits that receive a purple ribbon are eligible to enter at the Kansas State Fair as long as there is a corresponding department at the State Fair. To enter in the Kansas State Fair, 4-H members must be 9 before January 1, 2024. 4-H'ers who qualify to exhibit at the State Fair may sign up in the 4-H Building from 3-5 p.m. on Thursday, August 1. You may also call or email Christin with your entries. All entries must be into the Extension office by 5 p.m. on August 8. **Please note:** beef, sheep, swine and meat goat entries for the Kansas State Fair are due by July 15 and Horse Show entries are due by August 1. These projects have a separate entry process.

Barnyard Olympics Competition

Please join the Johnson County 4-H Ambassadors on Friday, August 2 at 9 p.m. or immediately following the 4-H Project Auction in the Livestock Pavilion for the annual Barnyard Olympics competition. This event is a timed, barnyard-themed obstacle course and is open to everyone! Teams must have four members and 4-H membership is not a requirement. Team sign-ups and a \$10 team entry fee will be collected at the 4-H Ambassador Booth before the event. 100% of the entry fee goes towards scholarships for Johnson County 4-H'ers to attend state events and camps and for the promotion of the 4-H program throughout the county. Please join us for a barnyard load of fun on August 2!

Johnson County Fair Parade

The 2024 Johnson County Fair Parade will start at 10 a.m. on Saturday, August 3, in Gardner and will follow the route of Madison St. to Center St. to Shawnee St. For more information and to register, visit https://business.gardnerchamber.com/events/.

Project Pick Up

All 4-H livestock and horses can be removed from the fairgrounds after 6 a.m. on Sunday, August 4. All remaining exhibits will be released after the church service which usually concludes around 8:45 a.m. 4-H'ers must pick up their entries or make prior arrangements with another 4-H family to pick up their entries on Sunday morning. If a 4-H'er does not pick up their entries it is the responsibility of the Club Leader to collect the rest of the club's entries.

Premium money will be available for pick up after the fairgrounds have been cleaned. It is expected that all 4-H exhibitors and their families help with fair clean-up. Requested corrections to premium checks must be submitted to the Fair Office by 12 p.m. on Sunday.

State Opportunities

Host Families Needed for Japanese Exchange

Eleven Japanese youth are in need of a welcoming Kansas Family to host them July 23-August 15. The Kansas 4-H International Program has 7 girls and 4 boys available between ages 13 and 16. Kansas 4-H makes host family assignments matching each delegate with an American same-gender host sibling that is no more than 3 years older or younger. Families receive the Japanese delegate's Personal Information Sheets so they can communicate and get to know each other before the delegate arrives.

Any Kansas family (4-H or non-4-H) with children aged 10-17 interested in the Japanese culture, may host. A separate bed is required, but not necessarily a separate room from the host sibling. Delegates are completely medically covered with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money for souvenirs. The delegates can go on host family vacations, camping trips, or join their host sibling for summer camps and the county fair. The focus is everyday family life.

New Procedure to Request County Council Funds

Requesting funds from county council is now done through Google Forms, in addition to the request made at a council meeting. Those that are requesting funds for experiences such as State Events, Shooting Sports Training Reimbursement, 4-H National Congress and International Trips, etc. will use the "4-H Council Funding Request" form. If there is a family that is in need of assistance due to financial burden there is the "Financial Burden Request for Funds" form. This form will be reviewed confidentially by Extension staff, edited for privacy, then forwarded to the Project Support and Scholarship Committee for review. Project Leaders and Volunteers must be Registered Volunteers

Adults providing supervision to youth at a 4-H program; making decisions on behalf of the 4-H program; having access to private data of 4-H members or volunteers; and/or handling funds as part of 4-H must complete the volunteer screening process, be accepted, and enrolled as a Kansas 4-H volunteer.

Volunteer applications and renewals are completed through 4-H Online. We asked that all returning volunteers complete their renewal by November 1, 2023. If a volunteer has not completed the renewal process in 4-H Online for the 2023-2024 year, they should not be volunteering for your club.
