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Greetings 4-H Families,

We hope your new 4-H year is off to a great start! This is the perfect time of the year to start setting goals for what you would like to accomplish for the 2012-2013 4-H year. Are you planning on exploring a new project or expanding a current project experience? Would you like to build your leadership skills or plan a community service event? The opportunities are endless.

As you establish your goals think about creating S.M.A.R.T. goals. Make your goal **specific**: think about the five W's, who, what, when, where and why? Goals should be **measureable**: how will you know when you have achieved your goal? Ask yourself, is this goal **attainable**? Given your time and resources is the goal realistic? Make your goal **relevant**: how does this goal contribute to your success as a 4-H'er and citizen? Create a **timetable**: when would you like to accomplish your goal? As you create your goals, refer to section I of your Kansas Award Portfolio and record your goals for each of your projects.

Check-In for Achievement Celebration

The 2012 Achievement Celebration is scheduled for 5:30 p.m. on November 3 in the 4-H Building at the Johnson County Fairgrounds in Gardner. This year's theme is Bubbling Over With Success. 4-H'ers receiving an award are asked to check-in prior to 5:30 p.m. Check-in will start at 5 p.m. and conclude at 5:25 p.m. 4-H'ers not checked in will not be announced during the ceremony. The celebration will include a dinner and the dress is semi-formal.

Enrollment Card;

All returning 4-H'ers enrollment forms are due to the Extension office by December I. Check with your club leader to see if your club has an earlier deadline. Although enrollment forms are due December I, enrollment is open to new 4-H families all year. Enrollment forms for 4-H members and Cloverbuds are posted at <u>www.johnson.ksu.edu/4HForms</u>. Please note the enrollment forms now require a leader's signature from every club you are a member of. This is to help the leaders get a better idea of who is in their club.

The project guide is found online at <u>www.johnson.ksu.edu/4HForms</u>. The project guide has been modified to cater to Johnson County specifically. We hope this new guide will explain projects better to new 4-H families.

Adding/Dropping Projects

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers will be May I. 4-H'ers who have not established project enrollment by May I will not be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair. Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. A report of project enrollment will be published on March I for families to confirm project enrollment. 4-H'ers will have until May I to finalize their project enrollment. National Western Catch-a-Calf Program



The National Western Stock Show Catch-A-Calf Program is a great program designed to promote youth development and understanding of the cattle industry. This program can provide youth with an opportunity to be part of one of the best programs at the National Western Stock Show. Youth who choose to participate in the contest may have a range of experiences in raising, feeding and showing beef cattle, all are acceptable.

Applicants must be between the ages of 12 and 18 as of December 31, 2012 to apply. They must also be enrolled in 4-H at the time of application. Successful catchers must have adequate facilities available to house their steer as they are responsible for the care, feeding, and handling of their animal. 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS PLACES VERY WELL AT 2012 STATE MATCHES!

Ten Johnson County Shooting Sports members participated in four Kansas State match events this fall, winning many awards. The first fall match was held on a very chilly October 6th near Topeka, with competitions in Archery and Small Bore Rifle. The second fall match was on October 13th near Wichita, with competitions in Hunting Skills and Shotgun.

Nine of our Archery members participated. Amy Ullrich took first place in the Junior Recurve competitions, including firsts in: FITA, 3-D, and Overall. Milton Lee also medaled in Junior Recurve, placing 3rd in FITA, 2nd in 3-D, and 2nd Overall. Amy and Milton were also on the Johnson County Recurve team, along with Emma Ullrich and Austin Woodard, placing 2nd. Amy Ullrich also took first place in each of the Junior Olympic competitions, including first in: FITA, 3-D, and Overall. Chase Eccles placed 4th in Junior Olympic FITA. Ethan Eccles placed 4th in Senior Olympic 3-D. Also competing in the Archery tournament were: Jordan Fletcher, Alyssa Overmann and Callie Roberts. We had some outstanding shooters representing Johnson County!

Bryce Zimmerman competed in the State Shooting Sports Match on the same day, competing in Small Bore Rifle. Bryce took 4th place in Prone, 4th in Silhouette, and 4th Overall. This earned Bryce a spot on our State Team to compete at 4-H Nationals this next summer, held at Grand Island, Nebraska.

Our county also did very well in the Hunting Skills competition. In the Junior division, Chase Eccles took 1st in Hunter Knowledge, 3rd in Wildlife I.D., 1st in Compass and Orienteering, and 1st Overall. In the Senior division, Ethan Eccles took 4th in Hunter Knowledge, 3rd in Wildlife I.D., 1st in Compass and Orienteering, and 2nd Overall. The team of Ethan and Chase Eccles placed 1st at state. Ethan will represent Kansas on the Hunting Skills team at 4-H Nationals this next summer. Ethan Eccles also participated in the Shotgun state competition.

Each of these shooters are to be commended for qualifying to attend a state match in their discipline. They all practiced very hard throughout the summer, including attending local matches. Accompanying these shooters were instructors: Arn Eccles, Aaron Woodard, and Barry Zimmerman.
