

Citizenship Washington Focus is an unforgettable opportunity for teens, ages 14-18, to build leadership and communication skills through hands-on learning in Washington, D.C.

In June 2026, Johnson County will take a delegation of 10 4-H members on an exciting eight-day journey, visiting iconic landmarks like Capitol Hill, the Smithsonian, and Arlington National Cemetery, while exploring democracy and constitutional amendments.

This program equips youth to become future leaders and change agents in their communities.

YQCA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance



program that focuses on nutrition, animal wellbeing, and character development, through age-appropriate educational curriculum for ages 7-21. This program is an annual certification that grows with the youth, so the learning modules are different every year.

Who needs to be certified?

- ALL Johnson County Fair Exhibitors: Youth ages 8 and older exhibiting in the beef, goat, sheep, swine, and/or bucket calf project must be YQCA certified by June 15, 2025 in order to exhibit at the fair.
- ALL Exhibitors at State Livestock Shows: Youth ages 7 and older who will be exhibiting market or breeding animals in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) are required to obtain certification.

How do I get certified?

Certification can be done by taking a minimum one-hour in-person training or an online training. Registrations and payments must be made through the <u>YQCA website</u> prior to attending a training. The online training is \$12 per youth and the in-person training is \$3 per youth. (If a family needs financial support, contact the Extension office.)

Families are responsible for printing their YQCA certificate, having it on file with the Extension office, and bringing it to county fair. Additional details can be found here: <u>Johnson County 4-H Livestock</u>

Livestock Tagging

All market and commercial breeding animals, including beef, sheep, goats, swine, and bucket calves, must be tagged by Extension staff on or before the designated tagging deadlines to be eligible to show in the 4-H division at the Johnson County Fair. The cost the Kansas 4-H EID ear tag is \$3 per animal. Commercial breeding animals must now be tagged to align with state guidelines, which is a change from previous years. Tagging dates and times are as follows and will all take place at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

If a family is unable to attend any of the tagging dates, they must either bring their animal(s) to the Extension office or pay a \$50 farm fee for Extension staff to travel to the location of the animal(s). All animals must be tagged on or prior to their species' last date to tag. Animals tagged after these dates will only be allowed to show in open class at the county fair unless prior arrangements have been discussed and approved by Extension staff, the Livestock Superintendent, and the Department Superintendent.



State Livestock Nominations

4-H members planning to show their animals at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) and/or the Kansas State Fair must submit nominations to the KSU Youth Livestock office. Market beef nominations are due by **May 1**. Commercial heifer, swine, sheep, and meat goat nominations are due by **June 15**.  monitor. Even if you are not registered to perform in any event for this day, you can
 volunteer to be a room monitor. We will train you on how to do it it's easy! Room
 monitor time shifts are for approximately 30 minutes. BONUS: serving as a room
 monitor counts as one of the optional requirements on membership pin applications.

 Johnson County Extension Agents will be offering judging activities in Family and
 Consumer Sciences, Food and Nutrition, and Horticulture from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.
 during Club Day. This a perfect time to learn about these projects and dip your toes
 into judging experiences. BONUS: this county level judging activity counts as one of
 the optional requirements on membership pin applications.
- The Johnson County Ambassadors will be sponsoring a concession stand during Club Day. The Ambassadors promote 4-H to the community, present to 4-H clubs and are 4-H advocates at a variety of local events. Proceeds from the concession sales support this group to do their work within 4-H and the community. Stop by for a drink, snack or lunch and support this group of leaders.

Spring Break Leathercraft Class

Instructor Randy Cornelius will touch on the basics of leathercraft including some history of leather, how leather is made, and the basic seven tools used to carve floral designs on leather. This class is geared toward youth above the age of 12 and is simply an introduction for those who have never done leathercraft before. Hands on work of carving and tooling a design will be done on a leather coaster.

The class will be held on **Monday, March 17th**, from 10:30 AM - 2:00 PM at the Johnson County Extension Office, Room 1060. The class fee is \$20 per participant. All the tools, leather, and other supplies will be provided. Each youth will also be supplied a leatherworking manual that is theirs to keep. Participants will need to bring two #2 lead pencils or a mechanical pencil, a 12" ruler, and a pair of scissors. The class is limited to 10 spots. **Preregistration is required <u>here</u>**. Class participants need to bring their own sack lunch.

This year, the theme is "By the Light of the Moon: Insects at Night." The goal is to explore

why and how insects are active or inactive at night, then create artwork that fits the contest theme. Art may be a drawing or painting, digital art, or a 3-D piece such as sculpture, stained glass or other media.

Kansas 4-H, Kansas Quarter Horse Association, and EquiFest of Kansas are teaming up to host the 2025 Kansas State 4-H Horse Judging Contest.

The Contest will be held March 21, 2025, in conjunction with EquiFest of Kansas in Salina.

Two contests are available - an open contest and a 4-H contest. Kansas 4-H members (ages 9-18) are invited to participate in the 4-H contest and may also participate in the open contest.

Cost to enter the 4-H contest is \$25. Registration for the open contest is \$15. Coaches should register teams and individuals here. Registration closes March 7th. Please be sure to read all rules prior to entry - 4-H Horse Judging rules.
