Johnson County 4-Hers Enjoy Spring Break Classes

Over spring break, Johnson County 4-H hosted two spring break classes open to 4-Hers and other members of the community. The first class was focused on leathercraft. Participants had the opportunity to learn more about the long process of making leather and learned carving and tooling skills by making a leather coaster. The second class was all about making homemade yeast bread. Kids were divided into groups, and each group made a different type of bread. Then, the groups came back together to learn more about yeast and try all of the different breads. These spring break classes were a great opportunity for youth to learn more about these areas and begin thinking about potential fair projects!



Food Fare Follow-Up

A new educational component was added to the 2025 Food Fare - each club was asked to present a foods & nutrition judging scenario. We had a total of **56** youth participate who increased their project knowledge and used their critical thinking skills. Adding/Dropping Projects & Enrollment Status

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers is May 1. 4-H members must be enrolled in the project by May 1 and be approved in 4-H Online to be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair.

Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. 4-H families can update this information any time in 4-H Online by simply clicking the Edit button in the Projects tab within the 4-H member's profile.

This option will be available through May 1 and after that the system will not allow any changes to be made to a 4-H member's projects.

Johnson County Fair & Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Shows

Johnson County Fair - To be eligible to participate, 4-H members must properly identify their horse with a Kansas 4-H Horse Identification Certificate by June 1 of the current 4-H program year. ****NEW FOR 2025**** The 4-H Horse ID Certificate has been updated for the 2025 4-H program year. Please destroy previous versions of the ID form and use the updated certificate moving forward. (Breed registration papers will no longer be acceptable forms of identification.)

****Since June 1 is a Sunday this year, 4-H members must have a copy of the Horse ID form signed by the 4-H agent on file at the Johnson County 4-H office by 5:00 PM on Friday, May 30, 2025.****

Horseless Horse Project - 4-H members participating in the Horseless Horse Project must turn in a completed Johnson County 4-H Horseless Horse Certificate to the Johnson County 4-H office by 5:00 PM on Friday, May 30, 2025 (since June 1 is a Sunday). Kansas State Fair - 4-H members currently enrolled in the 4-H Horse Project must meet four requirements to be eligible to compete at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show. One of these requirements is the horse must be properly identified for the Kansas 4-H Horse Project. This is accomplished by identifying the horse with a Kansas 4-H Horse Identification Certificate signed by the local 4-H Agent by June 1 of the current 4-H program year. Since June 1 is a Sunday this year, 4-H members must have a copy of the Horse ID form signed by the 4-H agent on file at the Johnson County 4-H office by 5:00 PM on Friday, May 30, 2025.

****NEW FOR 2025**** The 4-H Horse ID Certificate has been updated for the 2025 4-H program year. Please destroy previous versions of the ID form and use the updated certificate moving forward. (Breed registration papers will no longer be acceptable forms of identification.)

3-Year-Old Snaffle Bit Project Nominations - The 3-year-old snaffle bit project nomination/ID Certificate is to be postmarked on or before June 1 along with a \$10 fee. Nominations are made through the Johnson County 4-H office and then sent to the State 4-H office, so plan ahead! Fair Book & Updates

The 2025 Fair Book has been updated and is **now available** on our [website](#).

Note the following additions & changes for 2025:

- 4-H entries for exhibits judged during the county fair will be due **2 weeks before the start of fair week**. That deadline for 2025 is **Monday, July 14 at 6:00 PM**.
- The **4-H/FFA Livestock Auction** will be a non-terminal sale. (Members can sell for a premium and go on to show that animal at the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or KJLS.)

- **4-H Project Auction** entry forms may be submitted in person or online.
- Classes for Recycled Clothing Project were added to the **4-H Sewing & Textile Design Department**.
- The **4-H Fashion Revue Department** (formerly Shopping in Style) has a class change.
- The **4-H Flowers Department** has class changes.
- **Photography** conference judging will now be offered on Monday night as well.
- **Show N' Grow**, a new class for youth with disabilities to display their progress, has been added to the 4-H Astronomy, Crafts, Foods & Nutrition, Geology, and Table Setting Departments. See note below for more information.
- The **Sheep Grooming Contest** will be an individual competition.
- The **4-H Dog Department** has class and rules changes.
- The **4-H Horse Department** has class and rules changes.

Show N' Grow

We are excited to offer a new program at the fair this year called "Show and Grow". In our first year, we will be piloting this class in Table Setting, Geology, Foods and Nutrition, Astronomy and Crafts. This will allow 4-H'ers with special needs to participate in a different way, allowing for families to focus on individual growth across the years with a template to showcase their efforts. 4-H'ers will set personal goals for the area of interest and families will support their 4-H'er through practice and documentation as they work together to meet the goal. The final product will be shared with a special judge at the fair and each 4-H'er will be scored based on progress towards the individual goal. This new program allows 4-H'ers to personalize their projects based on their abilities and interests and allows participation in areas that might not have been accessible to them in the past. YQCA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program that focuses on nutrition, animal wellbeing, and character development, through age-appropriate educational curriculum for ages 7-21. This program is an annual certification that grows with the youth, so the learning modules are different every year.

Who needs to be certified?

- ALL Johnson County Fair Exhibitors: Youth ages 8 and older exhibiting in the beef, goat, sheep, swine, and/or bucket calf project must be YQCA certified by June 15, 2025 in order to exhibit at the fair.
- ALL Exhibitors at State Livestock Shows: Youth ages 7 and older who will be exhibiting market or breeding animals in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive or Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) are required to obtain certification.

How do I get certified?

Certification can be done by taking a minimum one-hour in-person training or an online training. Registrations and payments must be made through the [YQCA website](#) prior to attending a training. The online training is \$12 per youth and the in-person training is \$3 per youth. (If a family needs financial support, contact the Extension office.)

Families are responsible for printing their YQCA certificate, having it on file with the Extension office, and bringing it to county fair. Additional details can be found here: [Johnson County 4-H Livestock](#)

The last in-person training that Johnson County 4-H will hold at the Extension office is Tuesday, May 6th at 6:00 PM.

Livestock Tagging

All market and commercial breeding animals, including beef, sheep, goats, swine, and bucket calves, must be tagged by **Extension staff on or before the designated tagging deadlines to be eligible to show in the 4-H division at the Johnson County Fair**. The cost of the Kansas 4-H EID ear tag is \$3 per animal. Commercial breeding animals must now be tagged to align with state guidelines, which is a change from previous years. Tagging dates and times are as follows and will all take place at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

If a family is unable to attend any of the tagging dates, they must either bring their animal(s) to the Extension office or pay a \$50 farm fee for Extension staff to travel to the location of the animal(s). All animals must be tagged on or prior to their species' last date to tag. Animals tagged after these dates will only be allowed to show in open class at the county fair unless prior arrangements have been discussed and approved by Extension staff, the Livestock Superintendent, and the Department Superintendent.



State Livestock Nominations

4-H members planning to show their animals at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) and/or the Kansas State Fair must submit nominations to the KSU Youth Livestock office. Market beef nominations are due by **May 1**. Commercial heifer, swine, sheep, and meat goat nominations are due by **June 15**. WyCo Horsemanship Clinic

This 4-H youth horsemanship clinic, hosted by Wyandotte County 4-H, is being offered to our county members. This is a mounted clinic and 4-Hers will need to provide their own horse and tack. The clinician is Clarissa Conrad-Lierz, former K-State Horse Judging Team Coach, Texas A&M Summer Horsemanship Clinician, and current trainer in AQHA, PtHA, & USEF. Proper riding attire is required. Boots, riding pants, and helmets are required while riding. Current Coggins papers AND health certificates are required for all horses to who enter the

American Royal facilities. **Take note** - since the clinic will technically be in MO, horses are required to have a 30 day health certificate and 4-Hers are required to wear helmets when mounted.

This clinic will be held **Saturday, May 10th**, 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM at the Tom Bass Arena - American Royal (1701 American Royal Ct, Kansas City, MO 64102). Read more in the flyer [here](#) and registration can be found [here](#).

IPM Insect Art Contest

Calling all YOUTH and ADULT artists! Another insect art contest opportunity! The K-State Research and Extension Pesticide Safety and IPM Program is hosting its annual insect-themed art contest, open to all ages and skill levels in Kansas!

This year, the theme is "By the Light of the Moon: Insects at Night." The goal is to explore why and how insects are active or inactive at night, then create artwork that fits the contest theme. Art may be a drawing or painting, digital art, or a 3-D piece such as sculpture, stained glass or other media.
