2025 Enrollment

4-H Online opened October 1 for new 4-H members to enroll and current 4-H members to reenroll for the 2025 4-H year. We asked that all returning 4-H members be enrolled by November 1, 2024. **If you have not enrolled, please do ASAP.** If you are not re-enrolled, your family will miss out on important correspondences from the county Extension office and State 4-H office as only the contact information from 2025 enrollments in 4-H Online will now be used.

4-H Shooting Sports Hunting Skills Discipline

Would you like to learn skills in hunter knowledge, wildlife identification, compass and orienteering? Have fun in group activities learning about wildlife management? Have an opportunity to get introduced to Archery, Smallbore Rifle, and Shotgun shooting? Youth are not required to be a hunter, or even intend to hunt, although having some knowledge of hunting may be helpful.

Hunting Skills is one of the disciplines within Kansas 4-H Shooting Sports. While it does have shooting disciplines incorporated for those old enough to meet 4-H requirements and are interested, it also provides knowledge about history of hunting, why we hunt, how hunters and hunting support wildlife management, survival skills, etc. We have meetings that include youth from surrounding counties who all enjoy the project. Opportunities are available to attend local, state, and national competitions. Three members of our group will be participating in the National 4-H Shooting Sports Championship Match next summer!

Our first beginner's class will be **January 10 at 6:30 PM** at the Johnson County Extension Office. Members will learn more about how Hunting Skills fits into the shooting sports program and cover our first unit, History of Hunting. **Youth wishing to be involved in the discipline will need to get enrolled in the project through 4-H Online.**

County-Wide Electricity Project Meeting

STEM: Getting a Charge Out of Electricity

Are you interested in learning about electricity? Do you wonder what makes the lights and TV turn on? Need help getting started with a fair project idea? A class will be held at the Johnson County Extension Office on **Wednesday**, **January 8th at 6:00 PM**. You will learn about electricity and get hands-on experience with a circuits learning kit. A parent or guardian must be in attendance.

Topics will include:

- History of electricity
- What causes electricity
- Types of electrical circuits (using the learning kits)
- Insulators and conductors (also using the learning kits)
- Basic home electrical safety
