Fantastic 4-H Camp Registration Closes April 17

Fantastic 4-H Camp is June 14-17. This is a four day/three night camp experience for ALL youth ages 8-12. 4-H membership is not required. Campers will ride horses, go canoeing, hike the trails and jump in the pool. There will also be singing songs by the campfire, making crafts and meeting new friends. Fantastic 4-H Camp is located at Rock Springs 4-H Center near Junction City, Ks. Transportation is provided.

Please note: This year we have separate registrations for boys and girls. To insure that we fulfill the requirement that each county provide one counselor for every four campers, all campers are being placed on a wait list. As counselors sign up, we will notify campers that they are officially registered and no longer on the wait list. Full payment is due by April 17 and failure to pay on time will result in the camper going back on the wait list. If we do not get enough counselors for the number of registered campers, your payment will be refunded in full. Registration closes April 17. Camp Counselors Needed

If you are interested in being a counselor for Fantastic 4-H Camp or Wild Clover Camp, the links to sign up are on the Johnson County 4-H website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/camps.html. Adults and youth are needed as camp counselors. To be a counselor youth must be at least 14 years old for Wild Clover Camp and at least 15 years old for Fantastic 4-H Camp. Male counselors are always greatly needed. All counselors must be Registered Volunteers (or become a Registered Volunteer before camp) and have a participation form on file.

Very Important May 1 Deadlines

Enrollment Status and Adding/Dropping Projects

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers is May 1. **4-H members must be enrolled in the project by May 1 and have an Active status in 4HOnline to be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair.** Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. 4-H families can update this information any time in 4HOnline by simply editing the 4-H member's profile. This option will be available until midnight on May 1 and then after that the system will not allow any changes to be made to a 4-H member's projects. If you have questions please contact your club leader or the Johnson County 4-H office.

Horse Identification and Horseless Horse Certificates

All Horse Identification Certificates and Horseless Horse Certificates are due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. on May 1. Appropriate forms can be found at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/events-programs/livestock.html.

4-H Horse Snaffle Bit Projects

Horse snaffle bit projects are due to the Extension office by 5 p.m. May 1. Along with the nomination, the 4-H member must submit the Horse Identification Certificate and a \$10 fee. Three-year-old snaffle bit projects must have been nominated the previous year and do not have to have been shown to re-nominate.

KJLS and KSF Market Beef Nominations

4-H members planning on showing their animals at the Kansas Junior Livestock Show and/or the Kansas State Fair need to have nominations to the Youth Livestock office by May 1. Information pertaining to the Kansas Livestock Nominations can be found at www.YouthLivestock.KSU.edu

Wild Clover 4-H Camp

This will be the second year for Wild Clover 4-H Camp. It is an overnight camp available for youth ages 7-9 years old (before January 1, 2017) and will be held June 2-3, 2017 at Wildwood Outdoor Education Center in La Cygne, Ks. Wild Clover 4-H Camp is a two-day, overnight adventure for youth wanting to get a mini camp experience. There will be swimming, fishing, creating arts and crafts, hiking, and singing around a campfire. The cost is \$85 per camper and transportation is not provided. Summer Cooking Day Camp

Has Your Family Completed Enrollment for 2017?

4HOnline opened October 1 for families to re-enroll current 4-H members for the 2017 4-H year and for new families to enroll. We asked that all current 4-H members be re-enrolled by November 1, 2016. **If you have not re-enrolled yet please do so immediately. Your family is missing out on important correspondences from the Extension office** as only the contact information from 2017 enrollments in 4HOnline is being used.

The Kansas 4-H office has made a step by step brochure for re-enrolling which we have posted on our website at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/forms-resources/. We have also posted the Kansas 4-H brochure for enrolling for new families. Please read the brochure to assist your family in re-enrolling, and here are a few tips to point out:

- **Log in to your family's existing profile. **DO NOT** create a new family account!
- **Most data will pre-populate from the 2016 year's data, but make sure you double check and edit items that may have changed from last year. Items like: Volunteer Status (Yes or No), Volunteer Type (i.e. Project Leader, Secretary, etc.), Club Name, Project changes, etc.
- **The Participation Form is filled out as part of the enrollment process, therefore no hard copy form needs to be turned in to the office.
- **If you are a Club Leader or Project Leader you will not be able to log in to your club/project until you have re-enrolled and your enrollment has been accepted by our office and the Organizational Report for your club has been turned in to the Extension office.

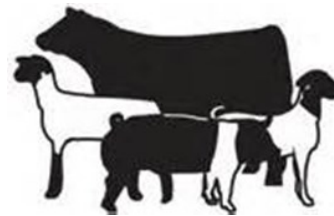
Join the Fashion Revue Committee!

Spring Beef Show - April 22

The Spring Beef Show will be held Saturday, April 22, at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning at 10 a.m. Pre-registration is due by April 10. The entry fee is \$10 per head, then goes up to \$20 per head after April 10. All market steers and heifers will be weighed from 7-9 a.m. on Saturday morning. 4-H Beef project members not showing in the Spring Beef Show will be allowed to weigh their animals from 6-7 p.m. on Friday, April 21, at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

Spring Goat Show - June 3

The Spring Goat Show will be held Saturday, June 3, at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning at 9 a.m. Pre-registration is due by May 25. The entry fee is \$10 per head, then goes up to \$20 per head after May 25. Weigh-in will be 7-8 a.m. Saturday morning. 4-H Goat project members not showing in the Spring Goat Show will be allowed to weigh their animals from 5-7:30 p.m. on Friday, June 2 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

Spring Sheep Show - June 3

The Spring Sheep Show will be held Saturday, June 3, at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning 30 minutes after the conclusion of the goat show. Pre-registration is due by May 25. The entry fee is \$10 per head, then goes up to \$20 per head after May 25. Weigh-in will be 8-9 a.m. Saturday morning. 4-H Sheep project members not showing in the Spring Sheep Show will be allowed to weigh their animals from 5-7:30 p.m. on Friday, June 2 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

Spring Swine Show - June 4

The Spring Swine Show will be held Sunday, June 4, at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning at 10 a.m. Pre-registration is due by May 25. The entry fee is \$10 per head, then goes up to \$20 per head after May 25. Weigh-in will be 7-9 a.m. Sunday morning. 4-H Swine project members not showing in the Spring Swine Show will be allowed to weigh their animals from 5-7:30 p.m. on Friday, June 2 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

Spring Bucket Calf Show - June 4

The Spring Bucket Calf Show will be held Sunday, June 4, at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning 30 minutes after the conclusion of the swine show. Pre-registration is due by May 25. The entry fee is \$10 per head, then goes up to \$20 per head after May 25. Weigh in will be 7-9 a.m. Sunday morning. 4-H Bucket Calf project members not showing in the Spring Bucket Calf Show will be allowed to weight their animals from 5-7:30 p.m. on Friday, June 2 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

2017 Centennial Delegates – National 4-H Congress

The Kansas 4-H Centennial Delegates were added in 2002 when National 4-H celebrated 4-H's centennial year. Kansas 4-H has permitted each Extension Unit to send one at-large delegate to National 4-H Congress. These at-large positions are called Centennial Delegates. Cost for the Centennial delegate will be the full amount of approximately \$1,150 (no registration grant is offered). To be eligible, delegates MUST:

- * Have never before attended National 4-H Congress.
- * Be enrolled in Kansas 4-H.
- * Have a genuine desire to attend National 4-H Congress.
- * Be available to attend 2017 National 4-H Congress in its entirety from November 24-28, 2017.
- * Be at least 14 years old but not yet 19 years old before January 1, 2017.
- * Remain committed to attending 2017 National 4-H Congress once they accept the trip.
- * Agree to follow the prescribed code of conduct, realizing failure to do so may result in the loss of privileges during the event and/or in the future.

If you meet these qualifications and this opportunity sounds exciting to you, please let Christin know of your interest by May 8, 2017. One name will be randomly drawn and the winner will need to provide a non-refundable \$100 deposit for the trip by May 11, 2017.

Great Plains SPCA Toy Donations by Maddie Anderson, Lucky Clover 4-H Club Reporter

Members of the Lucky Clover 4-H Club have been collecting boxes, old t-shirts, and paper towel rolls for the last several months. Following our February 14, 2017 meeting, Nathan A., a member of the Community Service Committee, showed the members of our club how to make dog and cat toys to donate to the Great Plains SPCA.

For the cats, club members made Hidey Houses - These were made out of boxes covered with a t-shirt, with the neck as the opening. Cats love hiding in them! Club members also made 3 different cat toys out of toilet paper rolls - 1) Ring Ball (cut rolls into thin circles and fit them together into balls), 2) Sunshine Toy (cut edges of roll into tabs and fold tabs outward, creating a "sunshine" look), and 3) Treat Rattle (fold down edges of roll, and fill the roll with cat treats). For the dogs, club members made pull toys made out of braided t-shirt strips. Our club made 25 Hidey Houses, 19 pull toys, and 67 cat toys. That's 111 toys in all, thanks to the members of the Lucky Clover 4-H Club.

Project Leaders and Volunteers must be Registered Volunteers

Remember that project leaders and volunteers must be Registered Volunteers in order to volunteer for your club.

There are three types of volunteers:

Direct Volunteer: A volunteer with authority to independently plan and conduct educational experiences for youth with adults present or in a public setting OR whose position puts them in close, ongoing, interaction with youth. (Examples: community or organizational leader, project leader, activity leader, judging team coach, camp counselor, event chaperone, exchange trip chaperone, countywide project leader, chauffeur for any 4-H activities, etc.)

Direct Volunteers are required to complete the Kansas 4-H Volunteer Screening Process.

Episodic Volunteer: A volunteer helping with a single "episode" or activity (usually with a Registered 4-H Volunteer present). Volunteers who are considered episodic volunteers serve as workshop presenters, judges, guest speakers, etc. **Episodic Volunteers are not required to complete the Volunteer Screening process.**

Indirect Volunteer: A volunteer supporting 4-H events or activities but not working directly with youth. Volunteers who are considered indirect volunteers serve on committees or boards. Examples may include local 4-H Foundation Board members or PDC members who don't interact with youth. **This person is not required to complete the Volunteer Screening process.**
