Team Kansas at the National Western Roundup Competition

On January 27th, 2024, Emma K., Gabby B., Izzy M., and Ann'adele K. from the Johnson County 4H Horse Club won Hippology at the State of Kansas' Panorama. With that, they decided to compete in the Western Roundup in Denver, Colorado, representing the state of Kansas. On January 8th, all four team members and their coach, Lindsey C., arrived and started preparing for their competition. They competed against 12 other teams, all from different states, and tried their hardest in five different sections of their Hippology competition. On January 9th, they competed in a written test of 100 questions, and a test on slides of 50 questions. They continued the competition early in the morning on January 10th with Horse Judging, and finished the day with questions in stations and four team questions. The awards ceremony was held the night of January 9th where overall team and individual scores were presented. To start off with individual scores, Ann'adele K. got 8th in individual stations score. When team awards came around, they got 8th in slides and exam, 6th in stations, 9th in judging, 8th in team problems, and 7th overall out of the 13 teams. The team was very proud of themselves after it all, seeing how they've been studying with Lindsey C. for this competition since the end of October. With that, the Johnson County Horse Club is very excited to send another Senior team to State Panorama this year for Horse Bowl with hopes to be able to compete in the Western Roundup once again.
