Greetings 4-H Families!

We hope your new 4-H year is off to a great start! This is the perfect time of the year to start setting goals for what you would like to accomplish for the 2012 4-H year. Are you planning on exploring a new project or expanding a current project experience? Would you like to build your leadership skills or plan a community service event? The opportunities are endless.

As you establish your goals think about creating S.M.A.R.T. goals. Make your goal **specific**: think about the five W's, who, what, when, where and why? Goals should be **measureable**: how will you know when you have achieved your goal? Ask yourself, is this goal **attainable**?: given your time and resources is the goal realistic? Make your goal **relevant**: how does this goal contribute to your success as a 4-H'er and citizen? Create a **time-table**: when would you like to accomplish your goal? As you create your goals, refer to section 1 of your Kansas Award Portfolio and record your goals for each of your projects.

Speech 101: Sharpening Your Presentation Skills

Save the date! Speech 101 will be held at 6:30 p.m. on December 6 at the Extension office. This interactive and informational workshop is for all ages and skill levels of public speakers. Topic areas will focus on the various competition areas that are offered at our County 4-H Club Day in February. December is the perfect time to learn about the various speaking events. 4-H'ers can work on their speeches for Club Day over winter break and be ready to show off their new skills by February.

Please note the enrollment forms now require a 4-H'er and guardian's signature. All returning 4-H'ers enrollment forms are due to the Extension office by December 1. Check with your club leader to see if your club has an earlier deadline. Although enrollment forms are due December 1, enrollment is open to new 4-H families all year.

Adding/Dropping Projects

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers will be May 1. 4-H'ers who have not established project enrollment by May 1 will not be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair. Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. A report of project enrollment will be published on March 1 for families to confirm project enrollment. 4-H'ers will have until May 1 to finalize their project enrollment.
