The Research Shows...

4-H provides young people with endless opportunities to meet other youth, have positive adult-youth relationships and gain valuable life skills. As we look for opportunities to grow our 4-H family, I wanted share with you a couple of key points recently discovered in the 4-H Study of Positive Youth Development conducted by National 4-H Council.

According to the study 4-H members:

- Report better grades, higher levels of academic competence, and an elevated level of engagement at school.
- Are nearly two times more likely to plan to go to college.
- Are more likely to pursue future courses or a career in science, engineering, or computer technology.

We have witnessed 4-H make a long term impact in the lives of countless alumni. In my mind, this research solidifies the positive influence 4-H makes in lives of our members. I appreciate your commitment to growing our 4-H family and continuing to make a positive difference for our young people.

Please note there is a \$10 fee for any nomination that is turned in with incomplete information. Household nominations will still be allowed. DNA Envelopes are available at the Extension office. Spring Beef Show- Saturday, April 28 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds. Pre-registration is due April 13. Weigh-in and tagging for Johnson County 4-H'ers not exhibiting in the spring show will be available from 6-8 pm on Friday, April 27 at the fairgrounds.

Spring Goat Show- Saturday, May 12, 2012 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning at 9 a.m. Preregistration is due April 27. Weigh-in and tagging for Johnson County 4-H'ers not exhibiting in the spring show will be available from 6-8 pm on Friday, May 11 at the fairgrounds.

Spring Sheep Show- Saturday, May 12, 2012 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, beginning at 10 a.m. (or 30 minutes after conclusion of the goat show). Pre-registration is due April 27. Weigh-in and tagging for Johnson County 4-H'ers not exhibiting in the spring show will be available from 6-8 pm on Friday, May 11 at the fairgrounds.

Spring Swine Show- Saturday, June 2, 2012 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds. Pre-registration is due May 18. Weigh-in and tagging for Johnson County 4-H'ers not exhibiting in the spring show will be available from 6-8 pm on Friday, June 1 at the fairgrounds.

Tagging and Weigh In

Tagging and weigh-in will be available for those not showing in the spring livestock shows the Friday evening prior to each show. Those not showing in the spring show are encouraged to weigh and tag the Friday before their respective specie show. 4-H'ers exhibiting in the spring shows will weigh and tag the morning of their respective show. There will be a \$3 fee for each tag. Cash and checks will be accepted. Checks should be made payable to the Johnson County Extension Council.

Bucket Calf tagging will be available from 6-8 pm on June I at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.

NEW in 2012- the tagging deadlines to be eligible to exhibit in the county fair are aligned with the nomination deadlines for the Kansas State Fair and KJLS. All market beef need to be tagged by May I. Sheep, goats and swine must be tagged by June I5. Any 4-H'er who tags after their respective spring show will be required to bring their animal(s) to the Johnson County Extension office. 4-H'ers not weighing in at their spring show will not be eligible to compete in Rate of Gain at the county fair. Either the exhibitor or parent will be responsible for tagging the animal(s) under the supervision of an Extension agent. An appointment is required. Our office is open Monday-Friday from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm. For appointments contact Kaitlyn Peine or Rick Miller.

Shotgun Project Members

We will have a Shotgun season this year for any of you that wish to join us. However, please be aware that you have to be a minimum of 12 years old (4-H age) to participate in Shotgun. We encourage families to join us at the safety class and at practices, but only those 4-Her's old enough may shoot. In addition to practices, we encourage participants to attend local 4-H shotgun matches, and hopefully have youth attend the state match in October.

Many of you may have your own 12 or 20 gauge shotgun to use. If you do not have your own shotgun, but are planning on purchasing one prior to the season, we encourage you to attend the safety class first before buying. We can help recommend guns for you to purchase. And yes, the helpful firearms experts at Bass Pro will also be willing to assist. For those of you not wishing to purchase a shotgun, our program has 2 guns that you may borrow, a 20 gauge and a 12 gauge. We will have to share these two guns during practices.

Details of where we will be practicing are currently in the works. JOCO Shooting Sports dues will get you into the program, but there will be additional expenses at each practice to pay for clay targets and shells. We will try to get some funding to help offset some of these costs, but that is not a given. Practices will likely be held every other Saturday. In the meantime, feel free to check with our online Google calendar at www.4-Hshootingsports.com. This will be your best source for up to date practice information. Click on Shotgun Club in the upper left, then toggle through the months. Note that only the safety meeting is currently on the calendar.

Meet at Bass Pro in Olathe on April 7 at 1pm in the meeting room for the safety meeting. Learn about the program, shotguns, gun handling, and shooting trap.
