#### **VIP-Volunteer Information Profile**

Johnson County 4-H depends on volunteers to help give our youth the best 4-H experience possible. The Volunteer Information Profile is to insure our volunteers have the best interest of young people at heart. Some people may not even be aware they are required to fill out a VIP. A volunteer who is an adult or teen with authority to independently plan and conduct educational experiences for youth with other adults present or in a public setting OR a volunteer whose position puts him or her in close, ongoing, one-to-one interaction with youth must complete the VIP process. Volunteer roles include, but are not limited to, judging team coach, community leader, organizational leader, project leader, camp counselor, camp assistant, Discovery Days or other event chaperone, exchange trip chaperone, chauffeur for any 4-H activities, and 4-H activities, and county-wide project leader. New volunteers must complete and submit the VIP Application at the beginning of their first year. Once the initial application is filled out volunteers fill out a shorter form called the VIP Renewal Form. This renewal form needs to be filled out on an annual basis. The fall is a great time to renew your VIP application. Please note the enrollment forms now require a leader's signature from every club you are a member of. This is to help the leaders get a better idea of who is in their club. All returning 4-H'ers enrollment forms are due to the Extension office by December 3. Check with your club leader to see if your club has an earlier deadline. Although enrollment forms are due December 3, enrollment is open to new 4-H families all year.

#### **Adding/Dropping Projects**

The project add/drop deadline for new and returning 4-H'ers will be May I. 4-H'ers who have not established project enrollment by May I will not be eligible to exhibit in the corresponding project area at the Johnson County Fair. Project enrollment is an important component of the project experience. A report of project enrollment will be published on March I for families to confirm project enrollment. 4-H'ers will have until May I to finalize their project enrollment. # **Shooting Sports**

The shooting sports project is getting ready to kick off its new year. The mandatory safety meeting is set for October 4 at 6:30 pm in the Green building at the fairgrounds. We will be discussing safety for all disciples available for 4-Hers at this time. They include, BB, Air Rifle, Air Pistol, Shotgun, Archery, and Hunting Skills. If you are a returning shooter and are not adding a new disciple this year you do not have to attend the safety meeting. However, this is also when we collect the fees for this project. As you all know we use targets, bows, bb's and pellets in practice as well as provide equipment for 4-Hers to use at practice. All of these items cost money to replace, repair and maintain. Because of these costs each participants must pay a \$35 participation fee (max of \$105 per family over 3 kids). This fee is also due at the time of the safety meeting. We also are required to have a completed 4-H participation form on file with the project coordinators and instructors so you will need to bring a completed participation form with you to the meeting.

At the meeting we will also be discussing practice schedules and when all the different disciples will be meeting for practice though out the year. The first practice for BB/Air Rifle and Air Pistol will be on Oct 12th at the fairgrounds. #### **International Travel**

Flyers for 2013 Outbound Exchange Trips to Argentina, Australia, Finland, Japan and Tanzania have been posted on the Kansas 4-H's World Citizenship web page. 4-H youth who will be 12 by June or July and not yet 19, are eligible for travel to Japan. For the other countries, they must be at least 15, 16 for Australia.

The flyers provide the details for each trip. The 2013 universal Outbound Application is posted there, as well. It is due by November 1, 2012. We also ask applicants to distribute one copy each of the Reference Form to the persons they list on the application. We ask agents to sign the application and provide a reference. It's on the same web page and should be returned to Mary Kay Munson in a confidential manner. Former 4-H'ers who are over 19 may use the same application form for the IFYE Representative Exchange. For Reps, we tailor the exchanges to meet their needs with our partner countries in various parts of the world.
