In November, 4-H clubs from the Johnson County area had an Achievement Celebration banquet. The 4-H clubs celebrated all the hard work and achievements done this past year. One of the achievements is winning a KAP (Kansas Award Portfolio) at county. The KAP is a book that 4-H'ers turn in to be judged, telling of all they have done in a specific project. 4-H'ers can do KAPs in projects like Reading, Fiber Arts, Cattle, Visual Arts, Leadership, Woodworking, Sheep and so on. To win a KAP, you must do a lot of leadership and citizenship in the project. Once the KAPs are announced as winners, they move on to regionals, if they win regionals, then they will be judged at state. If the KAP wins at state, the 4-H'er will be recognized at the Emerald Circle Banquet, and will receive a scholarship to go to Atlanta, Georgia for Congress. Congress is a convention for 4-H'ers to grow in leadership, citizenship, and also to know other 4-H'ers from around the nation. Congress is the Friday after Thanksgiving. Archery 4-H SPIN Club

Archery will begin its season in early April with an Archery 4-H SPIN Club. SPIN stands for Special Interest, and serves a useful role to introduce new youth to 4-H and allow current members more of an opportunity to experience a project. This is a short term club that will meet six times and allow new, somewhat experienced, or even experienced archers the same opportunities to learn the sport of archery from 4-H certified Archery Instructors.

This year's Archery 4-H SPIN Club is for any participant between 4-H ages of 8-18 that has not competed in the State 4-H Archery Match in the past 2 years (Archery Qualifier matches not included). Meetings will be at an instructor's house near Spring Hill on Sunday afternoons. Equipment will be provided at each meeting to all enrolled that have paid the equipment fee (expected to be \$30) and turned in a 4-H Participation Form. The Archery 4-H SPIN Club can only accommodate the enrollment of 30 participants, so space is limited.

Anyone wishing to potentially attend Archery matches and join the Archery Match Practice group this summer will need to first attend this 4-H SPIN Club. The Match Practice group is pretty full, but accommodations for a few additions will try to be made. Archery 4-H SPIN Club is an introduction to the fast growing sport of archery. An announcement with the date and instructions for enrolling is planned for the March edition of Clover Clips. Online registration is expected to open in early March. Kansas 4-H Citizenship in Action

This event is for Kansas youth to learn how the state legislative process works and how their voice and participation in decision-making can make a difference in their local communities. The legislative visit will not only familiarize youth with the capitol building, but will also show them how they can affect the legislative process. This two day event will be held February 16 -17, 2014 at the State Capitol in Topeka. The cost to attend is \$160. All youth 13 to 19 years old by January 1 of the current year are eligible to attend. This year scholarships will again be available in the amount of \$100 due to a generous donation from Capitol Federal Savings. 4-H Dog Care & Training Judges Certification, Recertification and Project Leader Training

4-H Dog Judges Training will be held January 31-February 2, 2014 in Wichita, Kansas at the Sedgwick County Extension Center, 21st and Ridge Road. Beginning on Friday evening allows for the ability to cover all four phases of the Dog Care and Training Program in one weekend. The training is also available to local project leaders and 4-H members (16 and older) as observers to learn more about what judges are looking for at 4-H dog shows. Any adult with experience in the show ring or as a dog project leader may also take the training to become a certified 4-H Dog Show Judge. A complete list of scholarships will be in the January Kansas 4-H Journal. Graduating seniors and college students are encouraged to apply.

Foster Children Grants Available

- Children must enroll as 4-H members through their local extension office.
- Eligible 4-H member can only apply for one 4-H project and one 4-H camp grant per year.
- Grant funds are for the purpose of starting or enhancing a 4-H project during the 4-H year such as purchasing a camera, craft supplies, clothing, feed, equipment, etc.
- Eligible 4-H member may request funds for supplies and equipment needed for participating in a pet or livestock project; however, funds are not available for the purchase of pets or livestock.
- Grant funding cannot include meal expenses.
- Items and supplies purchased from grant funding for 4-H project become the property of the eliqible 4-H member.
- Liability, maintenance and warranty of the items and supplies purchased become the responsibility of the eligible 4-H member.
