County Fair Entries

4-H entries for exhibits judged at the county fair will be due July 23. All entries for home environment, fiber arts, clothing construction, fashion revue, and dog show will also be due on July 1. Late entries will not be accepted and if a 4-H'er does not meet the deadline they will not be allowed to have their item or project judged in the 4-H division unless approved by the Fair Board.

All livestock exhibitors will be required to submit a stall request by July 1. All sheep, swine, beef and goat exhibitors will be required to submit tag numbers by the July 23 deadline. If your family has weighed and tagged their animals under a family nomination, you will be required to enter the tag number(s) with the 4-H'er's name who is exhibiting the animal by July 23. Livestock exhibitors: you must enter in showmanship if you plan on exhibiting in showmanship.

Only online entries will be accepted this year, there will be no paper entries. Closer to the date of fair, entries will be available to be made online by going to www.jocokansasfair.com. If assistance is needed in making online entries please contact the Extension office or the Fair office. It is highly recommended that you print off your entry confirmation.

After the entry deadline adding a class/entry is not an option. If you are not sure about what you are taking to the fair, please wait until closer to the deadline to make your entries. This will help keep dropped entries to a minimum as the Fair Board has to pay for each dropped entry.

In order to save time with project check-in at the fair, 4-H'ers with non-animal projects are encouraged to print their entry tags at home.

Mr. and Miss 4-H

The Johnson County Mr. and Miss 4-H Program recognizes young people for the leadership and commitment they have contributed to the 4-H program and their communities. All 4-H'ers who have been a member for at least three years and are at least 13 (as of January 1, 2014) are eligible to apply. Applications are due to the Extension office by June 27. Interviews and presentations will be scheduled for Saturday, July 12. Coronation will take place during the Fashion Revue on July 24. Food Preservation and Clothing Labels

Clothing labels can be made by typing, or printing in ink, on a 3" x 5" piece of white cloth: Class Number, Name, and Address. Please refer to your department's rules in the fair book regarding labels.

The Extension office has photo mats available for photography project members to purchase. Each mat is \$1.15. Photos exhibited in the 4-H photography division at the county fair will require a photo mat. The Extension office also has photo mounting directions available.

Cloverbuds Show and Share

Enrolled Cloverbuds are invited to participate in Show and Share on Tuesday, July 29 from 10 a.m.-l p.m. in the 4-H building. This is a reminder that Cloverbuds are not eligible to compete in the 4-H division at the fair. Full membership starts at age 7. Cloverbuds can bring a maximum of two projects to show and share. Each Cloverbud will sign up for a 15 minute time slot. A signup sheet will be available Monday evening and Tuesday morning during the entry check-in inside the 4-H building. Projects that are reasonable in size and are not living/breathing will be displayed in the 4-H building and available for pick up Sunday, August 3.

Project Check-in

Projects will be checked in on Monday, July 28, from 6:30-9 p.m. and again on Tuesday from 8-10 a.m. Projects not checked in by 10 a.m. on Tuesday will not be eligible to be exhibited. Please plan on arriving before 10 a.m. to have ample time to check in all of your projects. Livestock exhibitors, please refer to the fair book for your check-in time.

Project Pick Up

All 4-H livestock and horses can be removed from the fairgrounds after 6 a.m. Sunday, August 3. All remaining exhibits will be released at 9 a.m. 4-H'ers must pick up their entries or make arrangements with another 4-H'er to pick up their entries by Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m. If a 4-H'er does not pick up their entries it is the responsibility of the Club Leader to collect the rest of the club's entries. All 4-H entries and premium money will be available for pick up after the fairgrounds have been cleaned. It is expected that 4-H exhibitors help with fair clean-up.

4-H Food Stand

Each year the Johnson County 4-H Council has a food stand at the county fair. This is our ON-LY fundraiser for the County Council. County Council funds Achievement Celebration, transportation for 4-H Camp, Discovery Days, trip scholarships for 4-H'ers, Family Night and Officers Training, County and Regional Club Days and much more. A two hour shift at the food stand is a small price to pay for a year of all the great county-wide activities. The food stand schedule and information sheet will be posted at www.johnson.ksu.edu/4HForms. All 4-H families working the food stand should review the information sheet prior to the county fair to ensure a successful and fun food stand shift! The information sheet will be posted by June 1. On Monday evening (July 28) each club will need to send two adult volunteers to your club's assigned time. Those volunteers will need to also work during your club's assigned shift later in the week. This will help with efficiency and organization of the food stand.

4-H Foods Judging

The 4-H foods judging will take place at Wheat Ridge Middle School from 2-8 p.m. on Monday, July 28.

Canning and Preservation fair classes: 4-H'ers should only use CLEAR canning jars for the fair. Save the colored blue and green canning jars for home use. Colored jars may have to be opened to check canned ingredients and if it is opened it cannot go on for further judging. This a food safety issue.

Livestock T-shirts

All 4-H'ers exhibiting beef, sheep, goats and swine are required to wear blue jeans and the official Johnson County Fair Livestock Show t-shirt. The color this year is the same as last year which is turquoise. Each livestock exhibitor will need to wear their turquoise shirt for their respective show(s). If you need to order a t-shirt, please watch for ordering information to come.

Livestock and Project Auction Update

Livestock Auction: Exhibitors must turn in auction forms to sell their livestock to the fair office by 12 p.m. Friday, or 30 minutes after the conclusion of the beef show, along with a W-9 IRS form. **Project Auction**: Project auction forms must be turned in by 12 p.m. on Thursday along with a W-9 IRS form, no exceptions.

It is against policy of the Johnson County Fair for any livestock or projects sold at the 4-H/FFA auction to be shown at any other county, state or national competition.

State Fair Photography Update

From the 2014 State Fair Photography section:

- Photographic subject matter is expected to follow 4-H standards. For a sense of prohibited subject matter, review the Kansas 4-H member Code of Conduct; in general, if it is not allowable at a 4-H event, it is not allowable in a 4-H photograph at the State Fair.
- Photos with live subject(s) on railroad right away or taken from railroad right of way property will not be displayed in Kansas 4-H Photography and may receive a ribbon penalty.
- Copyright protections must be observed.
- Decisions as to display and/or penalties will be made by the Photography Department Superintendent and the 4-H Specialist responsible for the photography department.

State Fair Entries

All 4-H exhibits that receive a purple ribbon are eligible to enter the exhibit at the Kansas State Fair. 4-H'ers who qualify to exhibit at the state fair may sign up in the fair office from 3-5 p.m. Wednesday, July 30 through Friday, August 1. 4-H members must be 9 before January 1, 2014 to enter. All entries for the Kansas State Fair must be made by 5 p.m. Tuesday, August 12. Please note all livestock entries for the Kansas State Fair are due by July 15.


Swine PQA

One of the requirements of showing swine at the Kansas State Fair or Kansas Junior Livestock Show is having certification for Pork Quality Assurance (PQA). In past years, youth have been required to take an annual face to face training or if old enough, test out through a face to face testing. PQA is now available as an online training or testing. As a result, we will not be offering a face to face training in the county.

To receive the online training, or to take the online exam, log onto the PQA website at www.pork.org/login. 4-H'ers 8-12 years old will need a parent and their e-mail to register and take the training. Parents can also register for older 4-H'ers, but 13-19 year olds with their own e-mail can register and take the training or exam themselves.

If you have questions or need help, contact Rick at the Extension office. Remember that PQA certification must be completed by the time state swine nominations are due on June 15.

Tagging and Weigh-In

Tagging and weigh-in will be available for those not showing in the spring livestock shows on the Friday evening prior to each show. Those not showing in the spring show are encouraged to weigh and tag the Friday before their respective specie's show. 4-H'ers exhibiting in the spring shows will weigh and tag the morning of their respective show. Bucket Calf tagging will be available from 4:30-8:30 p.m. on May 30 at the Johnson County Fairgrounds. There will be a \$3 fee for each tag. Cash and checks will be accepted. Checks should be made payable to the Johnson County Extension Council.

New! Pre-pay Option

In an effort to help livestock weigh-in go smoother, 4-H'ers will have the chance to pre-pay for ear tags this year. This way all you will have to do is check in at the front table and then put your animals on the scale without having to worry about bringing cash or writing a check. To pre-pay for your tags visit http://tinyurl.com/LivestockTagPayment. This is not required but highly suggested.

Livestock Tagging Deadlines

All market 4-H/FFA sheep, steers, market heifers, hogs and goats must be tagged by a County Extension Agent or their designee on or before our respective Spring Show date. So if you plan to show livestock at the county fair, they must be tagged on or before our spring show dates.

State Livestock Nomination Forms


4-H'ers going to the Kansas State Fair or Kansas Junior Livestock Show must nominate their animals. To see the guidelines for nominating your animal(s) as well as the nomination forms visit www.YouthLivestock.KSU.edu. State deadline is June 15 for Commercial Heifer, Commercial/Market Swine, Sheep and Goat. (May 1 was the deadline for Market Beef.)

Forms Made Easy!

We have made filling out nomination forms much easier this year. All you will need to do is fill out the simple form found online at http://tinyurl.com/JoCoLivestockForm by the Thursday before your specie's spring show date and we will have a nomination form filled out with your information and signed by an Extension Agent ready for you at weigh-in. This will help speed up the process as we weigh-in as well as make it easier on the 4-H'ers. This will also help insure that you are filling out the correct forms. This is not required but highly suggested.

State Opportunities

K-State Youth Horse Judging Camps

The Kansas State University Horse Judging Team will host two separate camps to assist youth in learning to judge horses and give oral reasons. Please visit the website www.YouthLivestock.KSU.edu for more information and registration forms.

Beginner Camp - June 5, 2014

The beginner camp is designed for youth with very little experience judging horses and would like to learn more about note-taking and oral reasons.

Registration fee is \$35 per person and must be paid by May 10, 2014.

Advanced Camp - June 3-4, 2014

The advanced camp is designed for youth with some experience judging horses and would like to learn more about note-taking and oral reasons. Youth will be housed in K-State's dorms and will be assigned a roommate. Registration fee is \$115 per person and must be paid by May 10, 2014.

F.A.S.T. Academy

The F.A.S.T. Academy will equip high school students with the skills and knowledge needed to look at the challenges facing agriculture, food security and sustainability. Open to youth who have finished their Freshman, Sophomore or Junior Year in High School. Attendees should expect to attend the entire 4 days, 3 nights at K-State. Youth do not have to be a Kansas 4-H'er to participate! Attendees will have the opportunity to select two of the following five tracts while they attend the F.A.S.T. Academy: Food Processing, Food Safety and Security, Environmental and Natural Resources, Ag Engineering, Biotechnology. The fee of \$300 includes a conference T-shirt, lodging, meals, insurance, and program fees. Delegates should pay fees to the Kansas 4-H office. Payment is due by June 1. Registration is online at www.kansas4-H.org. Click on "4-H Event Registration" and then select F.A.S.T. Academy. Registration will open on March 15 and will close after the first 100 attendees sign up or May 15, whichever comes first.

State Geology Field Trips

The state 4-H Geology field trips are June 13-15, 2014. The trips are headquartered in Girard for Southeast Kansas Tri-State Mining sites and in Fredonia for southern and eastern Flint Hills sites. K-State Livestock Judging Camps

This is a three day, intense judging camp designed for 4-H and FFA members ages 14-18 who are seriously interested in enhancing their livestock judging and oral communication skills. Prior livestock judging experience is necessary for this camp. Workouts will be conducted similar to those at a collegiate level. Chris Mullinix, coach of over 30 national championship teams and KSU livestock judging coach, will conduct the training for each camp. The camp will focus primarily on the proper format, terminology, and presentation of oral reasons. Camp participants will also be exposed to livestock evaluation skills and incorporating performance records in the decision making process.
