2025 Enrollment

4-H Online will open October 1 for families to reenroll current 4-H members and enroll new 4-H members for the 2025 4-H year. We ask that all current 4-H members be reenrolled by November 1, 2024. The website for 4-H Online is <u>http://v2.4honline.com</u>. As a reminder, the \$15 program fee will be paid at the time of enrollment within 4-H Online. (Adult volunteers and Cloverbuds will not be charged the fee.) Enrollment guides for families and volunteers are posted at www.johnson.k-state.edu/4-h/forms-resources/.

A note to families reenrolling 4-H'ers...You will need to select the club and all desired projects during reenrollment as Projects and Clubs will not prepopulate from last year. If a project is selected that the 4-H'er was enrolled in last year, the years in project will increment correctly based on what number was entered the previous year. Kansas 4-H Member Achievement pins are designed to recognize 4-H members as they reach milestones throughout their 4-H journey. The pins are awarded in a series and as a member's 4-H journey progresses, the achievement pin requirements expand to challenge individuals to explore and engage in more opportunities to develop life skills. Working toward these achievements is not required but serves as a benefit to the 4-H'er as they work to lead and serve in their clubs, their communities and within their 4-H project work. Record keeping and Project Reporting are valuable skills taught to members. We will also recognize 4-H leaders and volunteers at this time. This is a county-wide event and 4-H'ers from several clubs will be present - this is a great opportunity to meet and mingle with members outside of your own club!

Shooting Sports BB Gun or Air Rifle Project

Join Johnson County 4-H's popular BB Gun and Air Rifle projects for another season starting in October. Youth and their parents can learn to safely and responsibly use firearms, promote sportsmanship and ethical behavior, get acquainted with the fundamentals of competitive airgun shooting, and foster shooting as a fun, family recreation. The 4-H Shooting Sports BB

Gun and Air Rifle projects are administered under the K-State Research and Extension 4-H Youth Development program and operated by a team of adult volunteers who are experienced in shooting and youth instruction, who have been recommended and background-screened by the county Extension office, and who have received mandatory intensive training and state-level certification in the rifle shooting discipline and in youth development training techniques. You do not have to own your own equipment to participate. The 4-H Rifle Club has sufficient safe and proper equipment to outfit most youth who are interested in participating.


