Application Deadline: May 30, 2025

Scholarship requirements:

1. Must have completed at least one semester of full- or part-time study in the Horticulture Associate degree program with at least 6 credits of horticulture courses from the required class list in the JCCC horticulture curriculum.
2. Letters of recommendation from:
 - A. One JCCC faculty member
 - B. One professional or personal reference from a non-family member
3. A copy of transcripts showing all completed coursework
4. Proof of enrollment in the following semester
5. Submission of completed application, questionnaire and recommendation letters by application deadline.

A check for \$500 will be awarded to apply toward tuition, fees and books. A second check for \$500 will be awarded upon completion of the following semester and receipt of grades. Recipient may be required to meet with Extension Master Gardener Advisory Board.

This application must be submitted to the Johnson County Extension Master Gardener Advisory Board by **May 30, 2025**.
